The Applicant:

1. Must be qualified to practice orthopaedic surgery in Canada.
2. Must be under 45 years of age on December 31, 2012.
3. Must complete a curriculum vitae according to Section C below and send to cynthia@canorth.org.
4. Must send an electronic photograph via email to cynthia@canorth.org
5. Must ask two (2) sponsors to send letters of recommendation to the Canadian Orthopaedic Association at the address below before the final date of application. One sponsor should be the orthopaedic surgeon in whose service the applicant had most of his/her training, the other should be an orthopaedic surgeon who is familiar with the applicant's work over the past three years.

6. Must be a Canadian citizen OR a Permanent Resident with a full time position at a Canadian hospital.

Note: The successful applicant must obtain personal medical insurance coverage for his tour overseas.

7. Must be able to take the tour in the Spring of 2013 (exact dates to be announced). The tour is approximately five weeks, and travels to the United Kingdom as well as either Australia/New Zealand or South Africa.
8. May or may not be a member of the Canadian Orthopaedic Association.
