The Honourable Peter Lougheed, P.C., C.C., Q.C.



Mr. Lougheed served as Premier of Alberta from 1971 to 1985.

He is currently counsel at the Calgary-based law firm of Bennett Jones LLP and serves as director of numerous public, private and not-for-profit companies. He is the Canadian Co-chair of the North American Forum, a member of the Trilateral Commission, and is Chancellor Emeritus of Queen's University.

He is a Companion of the Order of Canada, holds eight honorary degrees for Canadian universities and is the recipient of a Harvard Business School Alumni Achievement Award.

Mr. Lougheed and his wife Jeanne live in Calgary. They have four children.

Nicholas G.H. Mohtadi, MD, FRCSC



Dr. Nicholas G. H. Mohtadi was born in Birmingham, England. He lived in England, Norway, and Trinidad and Tobago before settling in Canada in 1967. He attended Oklahoma City University on a tennis scholarship and returned to Canada and the University of Calgary where he obtained his MD in 1981.

Dr. Mohtadi took a year off of his medical career to play professional tennis culminating at Wimbledon in 1982. He completed his medical internship at the Royal Jubilee Hospital in Victoria, BC and went on to complete his postgraduate training in orthopaedic surgery at the University of Calgary, receiving his FRCSC in 1987.

Dr. Mohtadi pursued subspecialty training in Calgary and the Alberta Children's Hospital followed by further fellowship training at the University of Western Ontario. He received an Alberta Heritage Foundation Clinical Fellowship award

to pursue a Masters Degree in Clinical Epidemiology at McMaster University in 1989-1990. In 1990 he received the Diploma in Sport Medicine from the Canadian Academy of Sport Medicine.

He joined Foothills Hospital Calgary in 1991 and has been at the Peter Lougheed Hospital since 1996. He currently holds the position of Clinical Professor in the Department of Surgery, Faculty of Medicine and an Adjunct Professor in the Faculty of Kinesiology. He is the Co-director of the University of Calgary Sport Medicine Centre and the Clinical Research Director of the McCaig Institute for Bone and Joint Health. He maintains a full surgical practice focusing on sports injuries and arthroscopic surgery.

In addition, Dr. Mohtadi continues to make significant research contributions that can be classified into three areas: 1) Randomized Clinical Trials 2) Outcome Measure Development and 3) Health Services Research. He holds grants from the CIHR, WCB Alberta and several local agencies.

The recipient and co-recipient of several awards, Dr. Mohtadi holds committee appointments with the International Society for Arthroscopy of the Knee Surgery and Orthopaedic Sports Medicine (ISAKOS) and the International Society for Hip Arthroscopy. He is a past president (2002-2006) of the Joint Orthopaedic Initiative for National Trials of the Shoulder (JOINTS Canada) and the Canadian Academy of Sport Medicine. He is on the editorial boards of the Clinical Journal of Sport Medicine, the American Journal of Sports Medicine, the Physician and Sports Medicine and the Journal of Sportorthopädie-Sporttraumatologie.

Dr. Mohtadi was the Head Team Physician and currently one of the orthopaedic surgeons for the Calgary Flames and the Chief Medical Officer for the Canadian Team at the 2003 Pan American Games.

Nick and his high school sweetheart, Anne, have three children Alexander (24), Geoffrey (21) and Olivia (18). He enjoys working out, golfing and especially fly fishing.

James G. Wright, MD, MPH, FRCSC



Dr. James G. Wright is Chief of Perioperative Services, and Surgeon-in-Chief, Department of Surgery at The Hospital for Sick Children (SickKids) in Toronto. Through these roles, which he assumed in January 2005, Dr. Wright oversees one of the busiest and most advanced paediatric surgery departments in Canada.

At SickKids, Dr. Wright is responsible for the operation of six surgical divisions (Cardiovascular, General, Neurosurgery, Orthopaedic, Plastic and Urology) and five Departments (Anaesthesia, Critical Care, Dentistry, Ophthalmology and Otolaryngology). An accomplished surgeon and researcher, he provides leadership to the Perioperative Services staff, ensuring a high level of engagement in complex clinical care, basic and clinical research, undergraduate and postgraduate education and numerous administrative responsibilities.

A Senior Scientist in the Child Health Evaluative Sciences Program, Research Institute, SickKids, Dr. Wright remains an active researcher. He has been appointed as holder of the Robert B. Salter Chair of Paediatric Surgical Research – a prestigious honour.

Equally active in education, Dr. Wright won the Robert B. Salter Excellence in Orthopaedic Education Award in May of 1997. Since 1994, he has served as or is currently serving as primary or secondary supervisor for more than 30 MSc or PhD students.

Dr. Wright currently holds three CIHR grants. He has more than 150 peer-reviewed publications and is Associate Editor for the Evidence-Based Orthopaedic Section for the American *Journal of Bone and Joint Surgery* and Chair of the Research Council for the Paediatric Society of North America.

Dr. Wright completed his surgical training at the University of Toronto, a clinical fellowship in Melbourne, Australia, graduate work in clinical epidemiology and a fellowship in the Robert Wood Johnson Clinical Scholars Program at Yale University. He came on staff at The Hospital for Sick Children in 1991.
